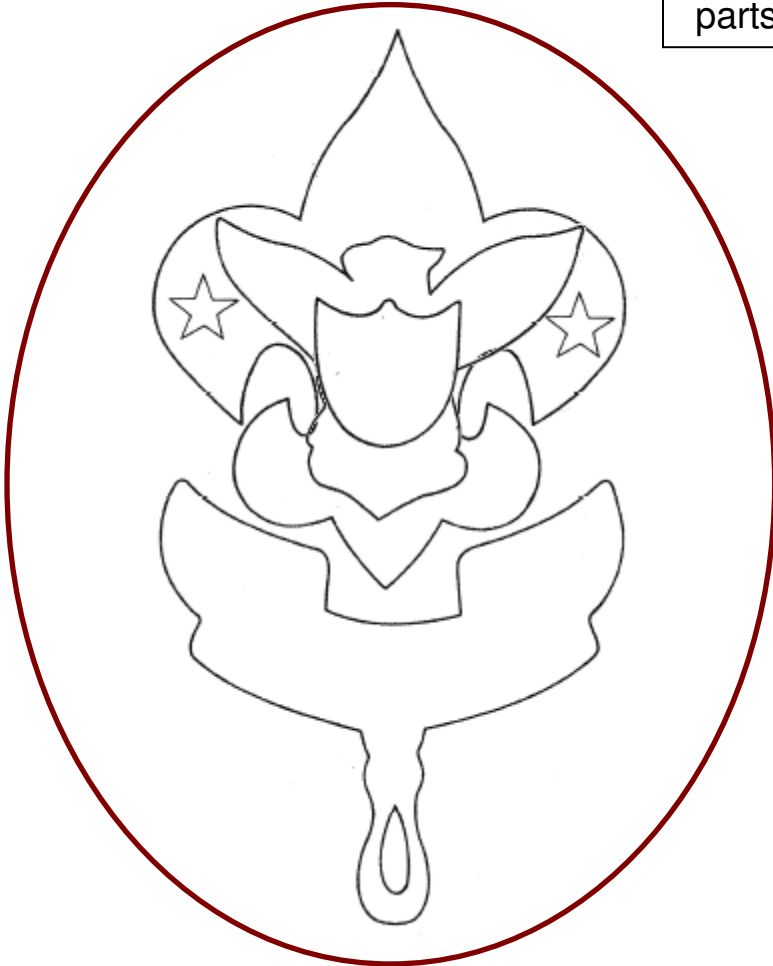




Shape of the Scout badge means a Scout can point the right way in life, like a compass points north



The three points of the trefoil stand for the three parts of the Scout Oath



Eagle & Shield stand for freedom and a Scout's readiness to defend that freedom



The two Stars symbolize truth and knowledge

Scroll bearing the Scout motto is turned up at the ends as a reminder that a Scout smiles as he does his duty



Knot at the bottom of the scroll serves as a reminder of the Scout slogan, Do a Good Turn Daily

 - Trefoil, or Fleur-de-Lis

 - The three parts of the Scout Oath (the three fingers of the Scout Sign also mean the same thing).
- What do the two stars stand for?
 - Truth and Knowledge; also the outdoors in Scouting.
- What does the Eagle & Shield stand for?
 - Freedom and readiness to defend that freedom.
- Why is the scroll turned up at the ends?
 - A Scout smiles as he does his duty.
- The knot at the bottom of the badge reminds a Scout of what?
 - Do at least One Good Turn Daily.
- What does the badge look like for the "Scout" rank?
 - The trefoil without the Eagle, Stars, and Scroll.
- What does the badge look like for the "Tenderfoot" rank?
 - The trefoil with Eagle and Stars.
- What does the badge look like for the "Second Class" rank?
 - Just the Scroll
- What is written on the Scroll?
 - The Scout Motto, "Be Prepared"
