Henry Bellmon

Age: 85 Career: His first term was from 1963 to 1967. He served a second four-year term from 1987 to 1991. He was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1968 and became the first Republican in state history to be re-elected to the U.S. Senate. In 1986, Bellmon became the first governor elected to nonconsecutive terms.

David Hall

Age: 76 Career: A Democrat, served from 1971 to 1975. Hall was indicted by a federal grand jury three days after leaving office. Hall, who always maintained his innocence, later served 19 months of a three year sentence for extortion and conspiracy convictions.

David Boren

Age: 65 Career: A Democrat, served from 1975 to 1979. Boren was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1978. He served successive terms.

George Nigh

Age: 79 Career: A Democrat, served from 1979 to 1987. He was elected lieutenant governor in 1958. In 1963, Nigh, 79, became the 17th governor of Oklahoma to fill the unexpired nine-day term. After being elected governor in 1978, he was sworn in as the state's 22nd governor Jan. 3, 1979. He was re-elected in 1982.

David Walters

Age: 55 Career: A Democrat, served from 1991 to 1995. While in office, Walters, 55, pleaded guilty to a misdemeanor election violation. He did not run for re-election.

Frank Keating

Age: 63 Career: A Republican, was elected governor in 1994 and was re-elected in 1998. Before being elected governor, Keating, 63, served in the administrations of former Presidents Reagan and Bush.
